# **The Proclamation of the Word**

## **A reading from the Book of Exodus (17:1-7)**

From the wilderness of Sin the whole congregation of the Israelites journeyed by stages, as the Lord commanded. They camped at Rephidim, but there was no water for the people to drink.

The people quarrelled with Moses, and said, "Give us water to drink." Moses said to them, "Why do you quarrel with me? Why do you test the Lord?" But the people thirsted there for water; and the people complained against Moses and said, "Why did you bring us out of Egypt, to kill us and our children and livestock with thirst?"

So Moses cried out to the Lord, "What shall I do with this people? They are almost ready to stone me." The Lord said to Moses, "Go on ahead of the people, and take some of the elders of Israel with you; take in your hand the staff with which you struck the Nile, and go. I will be standing there in front of you on the rock at Horeb. Strike the rock, and water will come out of it, so that the people may drink."

Moses did so, in the sight of the elders of Israel. He called the place Massah and Meribah, because the Israelites quarrelled and tested the Lord, saying, "Is the Lord among us or not?"

**Refrain: Our God split the rocks and gave them drink.**

Hear my teaching, O my people; incline your ears to the words of my mouth I will open my mouth in a parable; I will declare the mysteries of ancient times. **R**

That which we have heard and known, and what our forebears have told us, we will not hide from their children. We will recount to generations to come your praiseworthy deeds and your power, O God, and the wonderful works you have done. **R**

You worked marvels in the sight of their forebears, in the land of Egypt, in the field of Zoan. You split open the sea and let them pass through; you made the waters stand up like walls. **R**

You led them with a cloud by day, and all the night through with a glow of fire. You split the hard rocks in the wilderness and gave them drink as from the great deep. You brought streams out of the cliff, and the waters gushed out like rivers. **R**

**A reading from the Letter of Paul to the Philippians (2:1-13)**

If then there is any encouragement in Christ, any consolation from love, any sharing in the Spirit, any compassion and sympathy, make my joy complete: be of the same mind, having the same love, being in full accord and of one mind. Do nothing from selfish ambition or conceit, but in humility regard others as better than yourselves. Let each of you look not to your own interests, but to the interests of others.

Let the same mind be in you that was in Christ Jesus, who, though he was in the form of God, did not regard equality with God as something to be exploited, but emptied himself, taking the form of a slave, being born in human likeness. And being found in human form, he humbled himself and became obedient to the point of death - even death on a cross.

Therefore God also highly exalted him and gave him the name that is above every name, so that at the name of Jesus every knee should bend, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

Therefore, my beloved, just as you have always obeyed me, not only in my presence, but much more now in my absence, work out your own salvation with fear and trembling; for it is God who is at work in you, enabling you both to will and to work for his good pleasure.

The Lord be with you. **And also with you.**

The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Matthew (21:23-32, from *The First Nations translation of the New Testament*). **Glory to you, Lord Jesus Christ.**

When he arrived at the lodge, the head holy men were waiting for him. They and the ruling elders of the people came to him. "By what right do you do these things?" they challenged. "Who gave you this right?"

"First you must answer one question from me," he challenged back, "and then I will tell you what gives me the right. The purification ceremony performed by Gift of Goodwill (*John*), was it from the spirit-world above, or did it come from human beings?"

They put their heads together and talked it over. "If we say it is from the spirit-world above, he will say to us, 'Why then did you not believe him?' But if we say it is from human beings, we fear what this crowd would do, for they are sure Gift of Goodwill (*John*) was a prophet."

So they answered him, "We do not know."

"So then," Creator Sets Free (*Jesus*) said to them, "neither will I tell you what gives me the right to do these things."

"How do you see it?" he asked them. "A man with two sons came to one of his sons and said, 'Son, will you work in my vineyard today?' At first the son told him 'No,' but later changed his mind and went to work.

Then the man went to his other son and asked him the same. He told his father, 'Yes, I will,' but never went."

Creator Sets Free (*Jesus*) looked right at the spiritual leaders and asked, "Which of the two sons did what his father wanted?" They said to him, "The first one."

"I speak truth from my heart," he said to them, "tribal tax collectors and those who sell sexual favours will find their way onto Creator's good road ahead of you! Gift of Goodwill (*John*) came to show the good way, but you refused to hear him. You saw how the tribal tax collectors and those who sell sexual favours put their trust in him, but not even this changed your mind to believe him.

The Gospel of Christ. **Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ.**

## **The Apostles' Creed**

Touch our eyes, that we may see the sacredness in all creation. **Hear us, O Christ.**

Touch our ears, that we may hear from every mouth of every peoples the hunger for hope and stories of refreshment. **Hear us, O Christ.**

Touch our lips, that we may speak of the beauty of every tongue and dialect proclaiming the wonderful works of God. **Hear us, O Christ.**

Touch our hearts, that we may discern your mission in which you call us to be immersed, particularly in partnership with the First Peoples of this land. **Hear us, O Christ.**

Touch our minds that we may witness to your Good News in our neighbourhoods and cities. **Hear us, O Christ.**

Touch our hands, that we may forever shun violence and embrace the work you give us. We pray especially for an end to conflict between Palestine and Israel, and between Ukraine and Russia, and hold up all who work for peace. **Hear us, O Christ.**

We give thanks to you, Lord our God, for the goodness and love you have made known to us in creation; in calling Israel to be your people; in your Word spoken through the prophets; and above all in the Word made flesh, Jesus your Son. For in these last days you sent him to be incarnate from the Virgin Mary, to be the Saviour and Redeemer of the world. In him, you have delivered us from evil, and made us worthy to stand before you. In him, you have brought us out of error into truth, out of sin into righteousness, out of death into life.

On the night he was handed over to suffering and death, a death he freely accepted, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: this is my body which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me." After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: this is my blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

Therefore, Father, according to his command, **we remember his death, we proclaim his resurrection, we await his coming in glory;** and we offer our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving to you, Lord of all; presenting to you, from your creation, this bread and this wine. We pray you, gracious God, to send your Holy Spirit upon these gifts, that they may be the sacrament of the body of Christ and his blood of the new covenant. Unite us to your Son in his sacrifice, that we, made acceptable in him, may be sanctified by the Holy Spirit.

In the fullness of time, reconcile all things in Christ, and make them new, and bring us to that city of light where you dwell with all your sons and daughters; through Jesus Christ our Lord, the firstborn of all creation, the head of the Church, and the author of our salvation; by whom, and with whom, and in whom, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honour and glory are yours, almighty Father, now and for ever. **Amen.**
